

Tim Spratto is Vice President and General Manager of BAE Systems Jacksonville Ship Repair.




He is responsible for managing the organization that provides ship maintenance and modernization services to the U.S. Navy at Mayport Naval Station, as well as providing military and commercial ship repair services through the company's shipyard in Jacksonville, Florida. Additionally, BAE Systems Jacksonville Ship Repair is a fabrication provider to the submarine industrial base. He assumed the role in 2020.

A 1986 graduate of the University of Michigan School of Natural Resources, Spratto served more than 30 years in the U.S. Navy. As a nuclear-trained Surface Warfare Officer, he served his Division Officer and Department Head sea tours on the nuclear cruisers USS CALIFORNIA (CGN 36) and USS MISSISSIPPI (CGN 40) and on the aircraft carrier ENTERPRISE (CVN 65). Following a shore tour at the Naval War College, he served as Executive Officer of USS PORTER (DDG 78) and then commanded the USS FORD (FFG 54). Follow on command tours at sea included Commander Amphibious Squadrons 2 and 6. Shore tours included NROTC Instructor at Norwich University, Instructor duty at Command Leadership School, Director Capabilities Solutions Group JFCOM, and assistant chief of staff, material readiness and assessments for Naval Surface Forces Atlantic in Norfolk, Virginia. He retired with the rank of captain in 2016.

He is married to Brooke Spratto. The two have three children, three children grandchildren, and currently reside on Amelia Island in northeast Florida.
